


Youth Advocacy Summit

A Youth-Led Community Event






- A Canada-wide initiative funded by the Government of Canada and the Tamarack Institute focused on:
 - Increasing high school graduation rates
 - Improving youth (age 15-30) outcomes after high school
- Aims to reach students who may face greater barriers to educations, including but not limited to:
 - Indigenous students
 - Visible minority and racialized students
 - Students living with disabilities
 - Students living in a low-income household
 - Students identifying as 2SLGBTQ+
- Youth-led initiative
 - "Nothing about us without us"
- Began in Oxford County in January, 2022





YOUTH COUNCIL

- 20+ local youth (volunteers and interns)
- Either live or work in Oxford County
- Diverse backgrounds, life experiences, and perspectives
- Members from 6 of 8 municipalities
- Select priority areas and guide creation and implementation of CBYF efforts



LEADERSHIP TABLE

- Representatives from 15 local youth-serving organizations
- 4 representatives from the Youth Council
- Organizations from multiple sectors
- Support the implementation of Youth Council-identified priority areas, projects, etc. through sharing of resources
- Provide guidance around legislative and liability considerations

- Mental Health Training
 - Sessions of free mental health training for youth and adults who work with youth
- Youth Education and Employment Fund
 - Funds used for youth on an individual basis to address barriers to achieving their education and employment goals as a result of financial need
- Youth Engagement Grants
 - Participatory grantmaking model implemented for community-led projects focused on youth
- Youth Social Space (VIBE)
 - Youth-led social space in Tillsonburg





- Youth Engagement Training
 - Built a youth-led training on topics regarding youth engagement in collaboration with Wellkin's Youth Engagement Advisory
- Truth & Reconciliation
 - Held a training session in November, 2023
 - Doing ongoing work to implement the recommendations
- Sustainability Planning
 - Work on a variety of plans for the sustainability and survivability of CBYF
- Calls to Action/Advocacy Plan



Calls to Action & Advocacy Plan

- Co-created calls to action
 - Based on CBYF engagement of over 1000 local youth, as well as parents, teachers, and youth service providers
 - Informed by two literature reviews:
 - recent local youth-related reports
 - creating youth-friendly communities
- Incorporated calls to action into a full advocacy plan, including:
 - Held advocacy training for CBYF team February and March, 2024
 - Planning community event to present calls to action to local leaders in April,
 2024
 - And more!
