The purpose of our presentation is to outline concerns with speeding on Oxford County roads in the village of Drumbo. In July 2023 the 80km/h speed limits on the four Oxford County roads in Drumbo were moved from their previous locations—well outside the village—to positions that are immediately adjacent to the built up areas.

The impact of extending the 80km/h speed limit to the very borders of the village—in response to OTM guidelines—has caused serious concerns and frustraton among Drumbo residents. As a consequence, they were eager to add their names to a petition calling for the County to move the current 80km/h zones further away from the built up areas. Residents cited their frustration regarding the numerous, daily speed infractions that are occurring on the part of inbound and outbound drivers, especially commercial haulers. Participants also expressed anxiety about the safety of their children playing on sidewalks, for whom distracted drivers pose a deadly threat.

When our presentation was made to BlandfordBlenheim Township Council, the mayor and councillors voted unanimously to support our appeal by sending a letter to County of Oxford Council requesting the Council's consideration. The petitioners are anxious for their concerns to be addressed as quickly as possible before the school year ends in June, at which time— and throughout the summer months—children playing outside will have greater exposure to reckless drivers who pose a grave risk to their lives.
