# 6. DELEGATIONS, PRESENTATIONS AND CONSIDERATION THEREOF

6.1 Punkeydoodles Community Association

Ed Danen, Chair

Re: Punkeydoodles Corners Traffic Study

Ed Danen, Chair of the Punkeydoodles Community Association joins the meeting in the Council Chamber, indicating that the group of citizens was formed after a recent tragic loss to request improvements to a group of intersections that have become progressively more dangerous as populations in the area increase.

E. Danen stresses that the purpose of the group is to facilitate solutions, indicating that they have developed advocacy around short, medium and longer-term solutions. He thanks staff for the improved signage in the area as one of the immediate improvements. Through the use of a map, E. Danen points out that a major complicating factor around the group of intersections known as Punkeydoodles Corners is that there are multiple levels of jurisdiction involved, being three upper-tier counties and three lower-tier municipalities. E. Danen indicates they will be meeting with Perth County to further develop some medium-term improvements to the intersections meeting up with the curve.

In addressing long-term improvements and through the use of a different map, E. Danen indicates that in addition to the high population growth in the area, that many commercial and industrial projects are happening and are planned which also lead to increased regional transportation issues as people move between home, work and play. In addition to the above, E. Danen expresses concern with the major impacts Bill 23 and other road improvements like the Oxford Road 4 Corridor Study will have on traffic.

In closing, E. Danen indicates that the Punkeydoodles Community Association request the following from Oxford County Council:

- Request to move the traffic study for the Punkeydoodles area into 2023, preferably the summer of 2023;
- ii. The commitment from council and staff to support short and medium term measures for improvements to safety;
- iii. The development of a Regional Transportation Working Group involving staff and elected officials, with potential community involvement from all three regions to identify trends and issues and facilitate a regional framework for cohesive road and transportation planning;
- iv. To maintain open dialogue and information sharing with staff and council.

Warden Ryan opens the meeting to comments and questions from members of Council. E. Danen and David Simpson, Director of Public Works respond to comments and questions from Warden Ryan, Deputy Warden Acchione and Councillors Mayberry, Petrie and Schaefer.
